A. Governance

The Great Serengeti Migration Marathon is organized in accordance with the rules and regulations of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF), and Athletics Association of Tanzania (AT) under the provisions stipulated below.

B. Race Registration Rules & Regulations:

- 1. Entry application will only be processed after receipt of full payment of registration fee.
- 2. Participants of 21km and above must be over 18 years of age.
- 3. Participants in the 10 km race Executive run and Family Fun Run under the age of 18 must be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult. (kids of 5-12 yrs must run with their responsible guardian)
- **4.** All participants must ensure they are medically fit to participate in the race.
- 5. The organizer reserves the right to contact and interview applicants by phone for additional information required for matters relating to this event.
- **6.** The organizers will not be responsible for any disputes arising from incomplete/incorrect entry details provided by runner
- 7. In accordance with IAAF requirements, all participants in Serengeti
 Migration Marathon are subject to performance enhancing substances control procedures.
- 8. The organizers reserves the right to refuse entry to applicants who declare false information on their registration form, do not make the required payment, or who have been banned from competition under IAAF/AT jurisdiction or who have taken banned substances or who do not meet the entry requirements as stated in the Rules and Regulations of the governing bodies.
- **9.** The organizers reserve the right to limit or refuse entries and to close entries/Registration before the closure deadline without notice particularly when a specific number for a race is full.
- **10. BIB number** is not transferable to other persons or to future events. Therefore, it is a requirement for every participant of the Serengeti Migration Marathon & Antipoaching Run to be registered, given his/her entry number and recorded in the register of organizers.
- **11.** Anyone who enters the race without being registered and gets a valid race participation number, will have committed an offense and will be dealt with

according to the rules and procedures of the game. Either if it happens that a person who was not registered or someone who used someone else's number wins, he will not be eligible to be given any **gift/prize money** from the organizer or sponsor of the event.

12. It is mandatory for every Serengeti Migration Marathon & Anti-Poaching run participant to wear his participation number (BIB) from the beginning to the end of the race. The participant who fails to wear his number clearly will not be recognized as a valid participant of this race and whatever happens to him on the way he will be responsible himself, the organizer will not be involved in any support.

C. Race Participation

- 1. Whilst every reasonable precaution will be taken by the organizers to ensure the participant's safety, participants run at their own risk and the organizers shall not be liable for any loss and/or damage whether personal or otherwise, and howsoever arising during cause.
- 2. The Organizers and official event Sponsors reserve the right to use the participants' personal data, contact information, motion pictures, recordings or any other records obtained, collected during the race or submitted for the Great Serengeti Migration Marathon for any legitimate purposes, including commercial advertising, re-marketing, marketing of other Products offered by the organizer and those offered by Sponsors to the Serengeti Migration marathon.
- 3. Participants are required to wear an official Marathon race number on the front of their singlet/shirt.
- 4. Personal Trainers, mentors or coaches will not be allowed on the course unless they are entered in the event and wearing an official Marathon Race Number.
- 5. No un-official vehicles, motorbikes or bicycles are allowed on the course.
- 6. No pets are allowed on the course.
- 7. Race BIB numbers and Timing chips are not transferable to other participants.

- 8. Both Elite and Social runners are obliged to follow the instructions of Stewards, Race officials or Tanzania Traffic Police at all times.
- 9. All Participants must start at the official start Line and complete the full officially measured course as indicated in this guide. (eg. 42km, 21km, 10km)
- 10. A runner must retire from the race immediately if required to do so by any member of the official medical team identified by a reflective jacket and official ID card in case of any health challenge observed/occur.

D. Finish of the Event

- 1. Road closures will be lifted by the Tanzania Police in accordance with the schedule published in this runner's guide. The road opening* signifies the finish of the event and any competitor on the course after this time will be excluded from the result.
- 2. After roads are open (the finish of the event) the Tanzania traffic regulations apply. Any competitor still on the roads after this time is regarded by Tanzania law as a pedestrian.
- 3. *A trail vehicle or the stragglers bus will advise late runners that the roads are about to open to normal everyday traffic.

E. Conformity

It is the resp<mark>onsi</mark>bility of the runner to familiarize themselves with the event rules, the race formats, times and routes and any directions as published in the 'Runners Guide/event time table' provided with the Marathon Race Pack. Failure to comply with any of the rules may lead to disqualification.
